A BILL TO CLARIFY THE DEI PASSPORT POINT CALCULATION FOR STUDENT ORGANIZATION SEATING

Be it enacted by the Senate of the Student Government Association assembled. Section 1. Findings:

A. The Student Government Association at the University of Alabama adheres to strict guidelines regarding the allocation of student organization seating.

B. The current Code of Laws features dated information instructing the count for DEI Passport points for scoring student organizations for student organization seating in Bryant Denny Stadium.

Section 2. Legislation: changes in red

Chapter 1302.6.1 SGA DEI Passport portion of the block seating application is calculated as the number of members listed on the application multiplied by 1.125 will equal the number of points needed to receive the full 11% on the block seating application.

Chapter 1302.6.2 During the Asynchronous Training Session, students can choose to have their points contribute to an organization's total SGA DEI Passport points for block seating purposes. Chapter 1302.6.3 Members of organizations can elect to have their points count towards block seating applications regardless of their name being specifically listed on the application.

AN ACT ALLOCATING THE APPORTIONMENT OF SENATE SEATS FOR THE 29TH SGA SENATE

Be it enacted by the Senate of the Student Government Association assembled.

Section 1. Findings:

- 1. Article III, Section 7, Part F of the SGA Constitution empowers the SGA Senate to approve "the allocation of its members among the colleges and schools of The University of Alabama in accordance with this Constitution not later than 45 days prior to the annual SGA elections."
- 2. The SGA Elections Board has set the date for the SGA Spring Election as Tuesday, February 27, 2024.
- 3. The Student Government Association has requested and received the total enrollment by Level and College/School for the End of Term Fall 2022 from the Office of Institutional Research and Assessment.
- 4. The apportionment of seats to each degree-awarding college has been tabulated according to the requirements established in Article III, Section 2, Parts A and B of the SGA Constitution.

Section 2. Legislation:

A RESOLUTION CALLING FOR DISCOUNTED STUDENT RIDES TO COMBAT DRUNK DRIVING

Be it enacted by the Senate of the Student Government Association assembled.

WHEREAS, drunk driving is a nationwide issue that disproportionately affects college students, with college-aged drivers involved in around 19% of drunk driving accidents and several tragic incidents affecting students at the University of Alabama; and

WHEREAS, this problem is both current and pressing on the University of Alabama campus, as evidenced by the eight DUI incidents that were handled by UAPD since August 24th, 2023 alone.

WHEREAS, The University of Alabama and the Student Government Association care deeply about the safety and wellbeing of the student body; and

WHEREAS, 72% of UA students live off campus and thus typically do not use the Crimson Ride for safe nighttime transportation; and

WHEREAS, rideshare apps such as Uber and Lyft provide an excellent service for students to get home safely and avoid drunk driving; and

WHEREAS, some students are discouraged from taking advantage of rideshare services due to financial barriers; and

WHEREAS, other universities across the country similar to UA, such as Auburn University, the

University of Florida, the University of Georgia, the University of Kentucky, Mississippi State University, and Ohio State University, have implemented similar programs to offer discounted rides to their students;

THEREFORE, be it resolved, The Student Government Association Senate urges the University of Alabama Administration, specifically the Division of Finance and Operations as well as Transportation Services, to explore options for funding a discounted rideshare service for students utilizing Uber or Lyft programs.

Be it further resolved, The Student Government Association Senate tasks the External Affairs executive committee with following up with University of Alabama Administration to assist in finding the best way to implement this program.

A RESOLUTION TO INCREASE THE CROSSWALK TIME LENGTH BETWEEN THE QUAD AND ROSE ADMINISTRATION BUILDING

Be it enacted by the Senate of the Student Government Association assembled.

Section 1. Findings:

- 1. WHEREAS, the University of Alabama is committed to ensuring a safe and convenient environment for all its students, as well as an easily accessible and walkable campus; and
- 2. WHEREAS, many crosswalks, including the intersection between Reese Phifer Hall and Autherine Lucy Hall, run between 25-35 seconds allowing enough time for high volumes of students to cross the road; and
- 3. *WHEREAS*, students have short intervals of time to commute between their classes, specifically at the crosswalk between the Quad and Rose Administration building; and

4. *WHEREAS*, the campus is surrounded by high volumes of vehicle traffic, therefore students require adequate opportunities and intervals to commute between buildings.

Section 2. Legislation:

- THEREFORE, be it resolved, that the crosswalk timer between Denny Chimes and Rose Administration building be increased from 23 seconds to 35 seconds.
- 2. Be it further resolved, that the author of this resolution, Cassidy Matwiyoff, and the Vice President for Student Affairs, Andrew Fairburn, coordinate with the University of Alabama Police Department Traffic Safety Unit to implement this timer increase.

A BILL TO RECOGNIZE AND INCLUDE THE ANNUAL FYC SERVICE DAY IN THE SGA CODE OF LAWS

Be it enacted by the Senate of the Student Government Association assembled.

Section 1. Findings:

- A. The First Year Council is dedicated to crafting and passing legislation throughout its term to better the campus community, specifically the freshman class.
- B. Additionally, the previous First Year Council classes have held an annual "FYC Service

Day" to impact their campus community directly.

C. Upon examination, it was revealed that the annual "FYC Service Day" was not included in the SGA Code of Laws, thereby not acknowledging all the activities and duties of the First Year Council.

D. Thus, in the interest of fully recognizing and incorporating activities and duties of the First Year Council, it is crucial to amend the Code to include a specific reference to the event of the FYC Service Day, sustaining the tradition for future councils through SGA precedent.

Section 2. Legislation: changes in red

Chapter 902.6 The First Year Council will hold an annual service day event in the spring dedicated to improving their campus community.

Chapter 902.7 The focus of the annual FYC Service Day may be directed by either the codirectors or the councilors and may be agreed upon in any mode of consensus (digital poll, floor vote, etc.).
